Here's how to check out books: 1) Place a hold online. 2)Call the library to let them know when you want to pick up your book. 3) Once you are in front of the library, call the number listed on the parking sign in front of the library. 4) Follow staff instructions. You'll be asked to wait in a designated area, wearing a face covering, while your holds are brought to a table for you to pick up. 5) Enjoy your books!
