	Trash Bins: Keep lids shut tightly and remove water that accumulates inside. Drill several holes in the bottoms. Don't allow lid to collect water.		Flat Roofs: Water may puddle on flat roofs during the rainy season. Inspect weekly and remove any standing water.
	Boats: Check and remove water weekly from boat covers.		Rain Barrels: Cover tightly with a fine mesh screen
	Fountains and Bird Baths: Clean or hose out weekly.		Chain Link Fence: Cover hollow chain link fence posts with caps.
	Rain Gutters: Keep clear of leaves and other debris.		Drains: Make sure that drains are not clogged by debris and flow freely
	Potted Plant Saucers: Don't over water. Empty saucers regularly or drill holes in the bottom to allow drainage.		Lighting: Check garden lights and eliminate water from tops of fixtures and from inside floodlights.
	Tires: Recycle used tires or store in a covered area. Drill holes in tire swings.		Sculptures: Check for water that may collect in lawn ornaments. Drain or flush out weekly.
	Water Bowls for Pets: Rinse and fill with fresh water 1 to 2 times a week.		Screens: Install and maintain tight fitting window and door screens
	Water Troughs: Stock with free mosquito fish from District.		Water Under Home: Use a sump pump to remove any standing water.
	Leaky Hoses: Replace damaged hoses and repair leaky facets and pipes.		Wheelbarrows: Remove water that collects inside or store upside down.
	Low Areas: Do not over water lawns or gardens. Pay close attention to persistant puddling.		Tree Holes: Be aware that water can collection tree holes, crotches sand dead tree stumps. check with an arborist for best way to manage water or fill cavities.
0	Swimming pool and Spa: Keep filter and pump maintained and running. Monitor and maintain even when not in use. Remove standing water from bottom of empty pools and/or covers. report neglected pools and spas to the District.		Septic Tanks: Screen vent pipes with a fine mesh screen. Cover exposed tanks or manhole lids with plastic and secure in place. Place several inches or more of dirt or sand over the top of the area.
