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Rosemead School District Announces that All Five of its District Schools have been Named as 2019-2020 Educational Results Partnership Honor Roll for High Achievement in Student Success

Rosemead, California: The Rosemead School District today announced that all five (5) of its district schools have been named as 2019-2020 Educational Results Partnership Honor Roll for high achievement in student success rated at a “Star” category – the highest rating. The schools are: Encinita Elementary School, Mildred B. Janson Elementary School, Savannah Elementary School, Emma W. Shuey Elementary School, and Muscatel Middle School. The program, sponsored by the Campaign for Business and Education Excellence (CBEE), is part of a national effort to identify higher-performing schools and districts that are improving student outcomes. This year, the California Honor Roll recognized 2,568 higher-performing schools in the state that are distinguished for their academic achievement and closing achievement gaps.
