Additionally, the school utilizes the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program to promote positive behavior and cultivate a supportive learning environment. Muscatel has been recognized for its academic performance, ranking within the top 30% of California public schools and providing extracurricular activities, clubs, sports, and other recreational opportunities. Muscatel also offers families the ASES program for before and after-school care.
