#### California Education Code Section 39800.1

(A) As a condition of receiving apportionments under Section 41850.1, a local educational agency shall develop a plan describing the transportation services it will offer to its pupils, and ho it will prioritize planned transportation services for pupils in transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and any of grades 1 to 6, inclusive, and pupils who are low income. The plan shall be adopted by the local educational agency's governing board on or before April 1, 2025, and updated by April each year thereafter.

(B)

- 1. The plan shall be developed in consultation with Classified staff, teachers, school administrators, parents, pupils, and other stakeholders.
- The plan shall be presented and adopted by the governing board of the local educational agency in an open meeting with the opportunity for in-person and remotipublic comment.

# SOUTH STATE OF THE STATE OF THE

Low Income Eligibility, Homeless and Foster Youth

The Board shall establish financial assistance requirements which shall be reviewed and adjusted periodically to meet the needs of the District. (BP 3540)

Within the scope of services offered, and in accordance with law, Board policy and edministrative regulation, homeless students and youth in transition, when transportation is a barrier to accessing their educational services, shall be provided transportation on school buses, municipal buses, or through alternative transportation service providers, at no cost to the student.

#### Special Education Students

No charge shall be made for any transportation of students whose individualized aducation program requires transportation or whose perenta/guardians are determined indigent pursuant to administrative regulations. (BP 3540)
