As a result of the current national health emergency COVID-19 and as per Governor Newsom's Executive Order # N-29-20 signed on March 17, 2020, a local legislative body is authorized to hold public meetings via teleconferencing and to otherwise electronically to all members of the public seeking to observe and to address the local legislative body.

VII. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON ITEMS (3 minutes per person or 20 minutes per topic)

Mrs. Bracamonte checked the board@rosemead.k12.ca.us email account for submissions of public comment. There was one (1) public comment submission, as follows:

Lucy Tellez, student advocate

"Hello Board Members,

I am the educational rights holder and advocate for a child who attends Kindergarten at Savannah Elementary School.

As of the second week of school, my child has had to quarantine at home for five days, his class did not participate in the school's back to school night and he has multiple substitute teachers in and out of his classroom. I am aware that the school has no control over who gets COVID and they are doing their best to maintain the well-being of our children along with their staff members but I am disappointed with the effort being put into communicating with parents. I would like to ask the board to address the need to INFORM and COMMUNICATE with parents about the current situation and what is expected to happen.

If the teacher will be temporarily out, why not inform parents, is it possible to get a permanent substitute teacher?

Having multiple substitute teachers coming in and out of the classroom creates confusion for parents and children alike. Due to new covid restrictions, parents are not allowed to observe or visit classrooms in person so they must rely on communication from the teacher.

If quarantine were to be required for a whole classroom, would distance learning be offered? What about the children who eat breakfast and lunch at school, will they be offered these meals?

I would be glad to further discuss my next request, but I think it is very important given that my child is eligible for special ed.

I would like to address the need for all teachers to be given special education training to be able to identify a child with a special need and to be able to support them and teach them.

I appreciate your time and if you would like to reach me, I can be contacted directly.

IX. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared the following:

- Professional Development Day was held on September 13th and the District hosted a
 full day of offerings for staff. The morning session included harassment training, safe
 handling of chemicals, with afternoon sessions on supporting students with
 emotional needs. Lastly he shared that staff is looking forward to the next PD day.
- Thanked the Board for joining us at the first Reopening of Schools Parent meeting held on September 21st. He shared that unfortunately, the successful attendance during the parent meeting did not transfer to the SEL workshops that were scheduled following the parent meeting. Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that the District is seeking to get more parents to participate in the workshops that are scheduled. He thanked the Educational Services team for the SEL workshops and shared that the next meeting is tomorrow, September 28th.

- Shared that starting on Monday, October 4th, the District will start with random COVID testing for students who have a signed parent permission slip on file.
- Recognized and shared that he can't say enough about our staff and teams who are keeping everyone safe and keeping our focus on safety & well-being.

- Thanked Superintendent Ruvalcaba for hosting the parent meeting to help clarify the protocols for parents. She shared that the SEL sessions were very informative for parents.
- Shared that she attended the Teacher of the Year luncheon ceremony and congratulated Mrs. Cheung on her well deserved award and recognition.

Clerk Armenta shared:

- Attended the SEL virtual meeting. She expressed that she was very proud of the
 presentation and information shared. She felt that the information was well
 organized and would help our families better navigate the services we have related to
 mental health support.
- Congratulated Mrs. Cheung and thanked her for all she does for our students. She also thanked all the staff for everything they do despite everything that we are living through.

Trustee Esquivel shared:

- Gave kudos to the staff and shared that he recognized it was hard to return in person. He was able to attend some of the scheduled virtual meetings and appreciated the information shared.
- Congratulated Mrs. Jenny Cheung for her recognition as the District Teacher of the Year. He shared that the District has so many great teachers that it must be difficult to select just one.
- Requested for the Superintendent to follow up with the parent regarding public comment and see what we can do about the communication portion of the comments.

Trustee Peña shared:

- Shared that she was able to attend some of the workshops and appreciated the
 resources that the District is providing for the families. She shared that the resources
 are especially necessary during the times we are living through.
- Congratulated Mrs. Jenny Cheung on her well-deserved award.

Trustee Quintanilla shared:

- Congratulated Mrs. Jenny Cheung and shared that she is a great representation of the Rosemead School District as all our teachers are great.
- Shared that he attended the SEL workshops and thanked staff for the great resources for parents.

XVI. NEW BUSINESS

Trustee Quintanilla shared:

- Requested for staff to follow up on public comments regarding communication protocols.
- o Inquired if it is the will of the Board to possibly outsource some of the communication, marketing, social media, website, and branding. He felt that it would be a good time for someone to help us with this.
 - Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that the District sends information via Blackboard, Twitter, ClassDojo, remind, and our website. He also shared that the focus of the community is regarding the parent updates related to the pandemic. He felt that we lost our captive audience with the transition of meeting topics. Mr. Ruvalcaba also shared that hiring a Public Information Officer would require a permanent full-time staff member as it wouldn't be less work for us, provided we need to create the content. He requested for the Board to provide staff with the opportunity to present on the platforms currently being used, data related to the delivery of messages, etc. prior to researching the potential costs of a PIO. The presentation would come to the Board during the November study session.
 - After Board discussion, it was the Board's consensus for a presentation to come to the Board during the November study session.
 - Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that the next Reopening of Schools parent meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. to capture more families.

Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared:

- With the expiration of Governor Newsom's N-29-20 on September 30th, 2021, staff
 will be bringing a resolution every month declaring that there is a need to continue to
 meet in the current fashion. He explained that for some meetings now, both the
 Board and Cabinet have been meeting in person and would like to continue to offer
 the flexibility to allow the community to interact and attend the meetings via
 Zoom. He also shared that the District needs to prepare for next year, once we
 return to "normal", and the desire of the Board to continue broadcasting the
 meetings, including bids for audio and video. He asked for Board direction.
 - After the Board's discussion, it was the determined that the District will afford the public options on how to connect to the meeting, whether in-person or electronically.
- Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that the Facilities Master Plan prioritization is scheduled for October and that staff is in the exploratory process for playgrounds which was a high priority, including shade structures. He shared that if the District wants to schedule the projects for the summer, then we need to move forward with the project now.
- It was the Board's consensus to have the facilities team start researching these two projects in preparation.
- Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that in some cases we may need to redesign the playgrounds locations at some sites.





ESSER III Plan Requirements RSD School Board Presentation

October 7, 2021



What is ESSERR III?



- The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was enacted on March 27, 2020, and included Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) III Funds for K-12 schools.
- The ESSER Fund Plan is intended to address students' academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs as well as any opportunity gaps that existed before and were worsened by the COVID pandemic.

Other Plans Referenced

- In developing the plan, the district has flexibility to include community input and/or actions included in other planning documents such as:
 - Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP)
 - Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO) Grant Plan







Background

- March 11, 2021: American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act was signed into law which includes ESSER III funding for districts
 - Purpose: Allow schools to be able to continue to safely open and operate for in-person learning
- June 30, 2021: California Department of Education (CDE) released the Budget Expenditure Plan
- September 30, 2021: LEA's Budget Expenditure Plan needs to adopted by the Board and submitted to CDE to be eligible to receive ESSER III funds
 - District allocation based on share of Title I funds received
 - District and Schools have until June 30, 2024, to expend funds

What Are the Requirements?

- The District must engage in meaningful consultation with stakeholders and give the public an opportunity to provide input in the development of our plan.
- A plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services is required.
- This is federal money with associated rules and regulations, which include financial support (effort) and equity requirements.

How Can the Funds Be Used?

- The uses of funds are similar to ESSER I and ESSER II:
 - The American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires districts to use 20% of the funds to measure and address the academic impact of lost instructional time on all students through evidence-based actions
- These funds are designated for one-time or short-term spending to address learning recovery and the ongoing impact of the pandemic
- Long-term uses of the ESSER III funds is also allowable, but districts must consider how to support long-term costs after the funding ends.
- Maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff (including social, emotional and mental health needs)





Allowable Expenses

Training and Professional Development (PD)

Purchasing supplies to sanitize and clean the facilities

 Purchasing education technology (including hardware, software, and connectivity) for students

Providing mental health services and supports

Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental after school/weekend/holiday programs

Addressing learning acceleration among students by implementing evidence-based activities to meet the comprehensive needs of students

School facility repairs and improvements

Other activities that are necessary to maintain the operation of and continuity of services in the district


What is the California Growth Model?




Growth scores are way of measuring students' growth between the current year assessment scores and the previous year assessment scores.

The California Department of Education released Student Growth Scores on September 21, 2021.

48 other states have similar growth measures.



Every year, students who take the SBAC (Smarter Balanced Assessments) receive an achievement score. Results tell us how many students are meeting expectations for their grade, and how many students need some support to get there.



The new growth scores are also based on the SBAC scores.
They look at how much students improved from the prior year testing compared to how much they were expected to improve.

Growth vs. Achievement

Achievement:

How much students knew at the time of the assessment

Growth:

How much students learned from one assessment to the next.

How Are Individual Growth Scores Calculated?

Step #1:

Determine student's expected test score for students in grades 4-8 with consecutive test scores.



Step #2:

Calculate the difference between the student's expected test score and their actual test score. This is their individual growth score.



Step #3:

Calculate an average growth score for district, school, or student group.



What Can We Do with the Growth Scores Now?

2020 SBAC suspended 2021

SBAC "flexible"

Student growth scores are based on data from 2017, 2018, and 2019.

These scores are for informational purposes only.

They help us to learn about the concept of growth scores and reflect on how we can use them in the future.

Individual growth scores will not be given to parents.



3 more years of data are needed to calculate the next set of student growth scores.

We will get more information from the CDE closer to the release of those data.

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Reopening of Schools Update October 7, 2021



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Modified Quarantine for Students

- Allows for student close contacts to remain in school as long as:
 - The exposure occurred in a school setting (not at home or any other community location).
 - The exposure must have occurred while individuals were fully masked.
- Hodified quarantined students must:
 - Wear masks at all times while indoors and outdoors, including P.E. (except when eating/drinking).
 - Remain 6 feet apart from others while eating or drinking and remain in a designated eating area.
 - Submit to a daily health check by school staff.
 - Hay not participate in athletics, performing arts, extracurlicular activities, clubs...
 - COVID test on day I and again on day 5
- Soludents can be released from modified quarantine after day 7, with a negative test at day 5.



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
State Vaccination Mandate

- At the Governors direction, California DPH will add COVID-19 to existing vactinations required for in-person instruction.
- Upon full FDA approval of a vaccine, would be required in the subsequent term/semester.
- Will apply to all pupils of private or public schools
- Phased model by grade span, 7-12 and K-6.
- Exemptions will be allowed consistent with current practices
- The current verify-or-test mandate for adults will be converted to a vactine mandate for all to coincide with the
 first phase of student vactination requirement.
