  - Appears to be less severe
  - Our screening testing will identify the variant as COVID
- Boosters are highly effective in reducing severity of litness
- OPH recommends
  - Vaccinations (or all, including boosters (for those eligible)
  - Surveillance testing for all (currently required for unvaccinated staff members)

#### Educator Effectiveness Grant Plan 2021-2026 RSD School Board Presentation

#### **Background**



- The Educator Effectiveness Block Grant (EEBG) is a program providing funds to LEAs to provide professional learning and to promote educator equity, quality, and effectiveness.
- These expenditures may take place over five fiscal years 2021–22, 2022–23, 2023–24, 2024–25, and 2025–26.
- The funding is distributed in an equal amount per unit of full-time equivalent certificated and classified staff as reported in California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data (CALPADS) and California Basic Educational Data System (CBEDS) for the 2020–21 fiscal year.



#### Requirements

- Assembly Bill 130, Chapter 44, Section 22
- One-time funding to provide professional learning for teachers, administrators, paraprofessionals, and classified staff in order to promote educator equity, quality, and effectiveness.
- On or before December 30, 2021, develop and adopt a plan for how the Educator Effectiveness funds will be spent.
- The plan must be explained in a public meeting of the governing board of the school district, before its adoption in a subsequent public meeting.
- Submit an annual data report and an annual expenditure report detailing information to the California Department of Education (CDE) on or before September 30 of each year.
- Per EC 41480, local educational agencies shall coordinate the use of Title Il funds with the expenditure of Educator Effectiveness funds and to ensure professional development.



#### Allowable Expenses

Funds can be expended for any of the following purposes:

- (1) Coaching and mentoring
- (2) Programs that lead to effective, standards-atigned instruction and improve instruction in literacy across all content areas
- Practices and strategies that re-engage students and lead to accelerated learning.
   Strategies to implement social-emotional learning, trauma-informed practices, suicide prevention, access to mental health services, and other approaches that improve student
- (5) Practices to create a positive school climate
- 6) Strategies to improve inclusive practices
- (7) Instruction to support implementing effective language acquisition programs for English Learners (ELs)
- (8) New professional learning networks for those not yet in education to support requirements.
- (9) Instruction, education, and strategies to incorporate ethnic studies curricula
  (10) Instruction, education, and strategies for educators in early childhood education



#### Rosemead School District

- RSD will be awarded \$570,781
  - o based on 134 Certificated FTE and 102 Classified FTE
- These expenditures may take place over five fiscal years
- CDE does not have a required template for this plan
- LACOE provided sample templates










#### **LCAP Projected Funding**


