1. DISCUSSION - Update on the Reopening of Schools

The Superintendent provided an update on the Reopening of Schools and reviewed current COVID cases. (See presentation attached.)

#### XXVI. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. NEW BUSINESS Exhibit 1 Matrix for New Business Topics and Follow Up Superintendent Ruvalcaba provided the following updates:
  - Mini libraries have been completed.
  - M&O vehicles due to the industry-wide shortage of chips there is a shortage in new vehicles. Staff will continue working closely with the dealerships and the District is in the cue as vehicles come out.
  - Social emotional support hiring for elementary schools the District is currently advertising the position.
  - Additional support for M&O the District is currently advertising for the additional support.
  - District Office Marquee Dr. Rios met with Gloria Molleda our City Manager to discuss the District Office marquees and safety needs at Encinita.

- The City fully acknowledged that they have no governance on the District Office. The District must adhere to building codes and can elect to go through the City or DSA. There is also no limit on scrolling text or other items. The marquee does however need to stand on pedestals, a concrete base, and follow height limitations. It was clarified that the District does not need to follow any City ordinances.
- The safety at Encinita cross streets was discussed and the City understands the severity of safety concerns following several car accidents with cars landing on the campus next to classrooms and offices. We've requested that the City research the addition of barriers or ballards to address the safety concerns. Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that the District needs to be a partner to the City to ensure safety is addressed which encompasses the sidewalk safety. At this time there is no timeline on this project, however, the City has been very responsive regarding this concern.

#### Trustee Esquivel:

- Agenda preparation recommended that when we get to this point that we go all in or not do it. It'll be a lot of work for Mrs. Bracamonte to continue producing 2 packets including a digital and a paper version. He recommended that Trustees commit to one or the other. He suggested that Board consider going digital.
- Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that Mrs. Bracamonte has prepared two presentations which he is currently reviewing. She will walk us through what it takes to prepare each Board agenda packet so that the Board understands the work that goes into preparing both the digital online version and the paper copies. She will also walk us through the environment if we go all electronic with no paper copies.
  - Superintendent Ruvalcaba shared that the preparation of 2 packets for each meeting is exponential hands on work for our office.
  - The Board agreed that they will revisit the agenda packet conversation after we walk the Board through the digital environment with the hands on demonstration on 9/16/2021.

I am writing to you to voice my concerns about Covid testing for students. More importantly, because our children are unable to be vaccinated, we cannot take lightly the risk that they will be ok. Remember when there were no vaccinations in sight, we were frantic and highly

cautious. Why can't this same sense of urgency apply to our kids? If they don't have a voice, let mine represent my children.

Also as you know, kids are kids, they like to interact with others and often times forget what social distancing means. If we can't control this aspect, let's try to control
